Spring Field Preparation

- If power lines on your property start to sag so low you cannot work safely, contact us. Never try to move a power line on your own.
- · If a guy wire is broken, it can become charged with electricity. If you break a guy wire, call us to fix it, do not do it yourself.
- Farmers may want to consider moving or burying power lines around buildings or busy pathways where many farm activities take place.
- Everyone should know where underground utilities are located, and how to avoid them. Before digging, call 8-1-1.
